Pressures to Food Security



Demand Side Pressure

- •20% Food increase by 2030
- •High population regions over lap with countries faced with food security risks
- •23 OIC countries need external food assistance
- •Estimated \$280 billion annual Food Financing global gap.

Supply Side Pressure

- Available arable land has stagnated
- •Urbanization leading to career switching – Small scale farmers
- •Limited Public Sector support and fundings
- •1/3 of the OIC food production is wasted





ICCIA, Small Farm holders and Food Security

Small Farm-holders importance to Food Security

Over 80% of the Farms are smaller than two hectares

90% of the produce of Small farm holder is locally consumed in OIC countries

Over 50% of the workforce in female.

Small Holder Agriculture accounts for over 50% OIC labor Force.

Green Waqf Initiative

"Waqf" is the Islamic principle of endowment. By engaging relevant stakeholders such as government counterparts, the project will utilize idle, unproductive lands towards sustainable agriculture and reforestation.

Pilot Countries: Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Morocco, Sudan

Climate Change

 9 OIC countries at risk of severe climate change

Deforestation

• 1% annual deforestation in 22% OIC countries

GDP Loss

 2% GDP faced by LDCs in 9 OIC countries at risk of severe climate change

Food Insecurity

- 10% OIC population undernourished
- 24 OIC countries face acute shortage

Socio-Economic development of local communities strengthened resilience and adaptive capacity to climaterelated hazards and natural disasters, and enhanced food security while integrate climate change measures into national policies, strategies and planning

Self Sustaining Model

 Establishing self-sustaining Green Waqf projects without donor support to sustain operational costs.

Social Financing Mechanisms

•Establishing mechanisms of Social/Community financing to sustain implemented projects.

Inclusive Development

•Ensuring that growth and development are inclusive and sustainable, incorporating. productive capacities that create employment and livelihoods for vulnerable communities.

Scalability

•Ensuring Scaled up implementation first to all pilot countries and then to OIC member states.

Knowledge Exchange

•Enhanced access to social finance and knowledge exchange across the countries on leveraging and management of the social finance.



Agri-Tech Incubator

Agricultural focused incubator working with young entrepreneurs, small farm holders and university graduates to develop commercially viable agri-solutions, supporting food systems and security across the value chain.

Poverty

• 241 million people living under the poverty line

Food Insecurity

- 10% OIC population undernourished
- 24 OIC countries face acute shortage

Employment

- 41.7% of working age population inactive
- High working age population unemployed

Food Import

• \$217.4 billion food imports against \$154.5 billion exports


Agricultural Commodity Exchange Market
